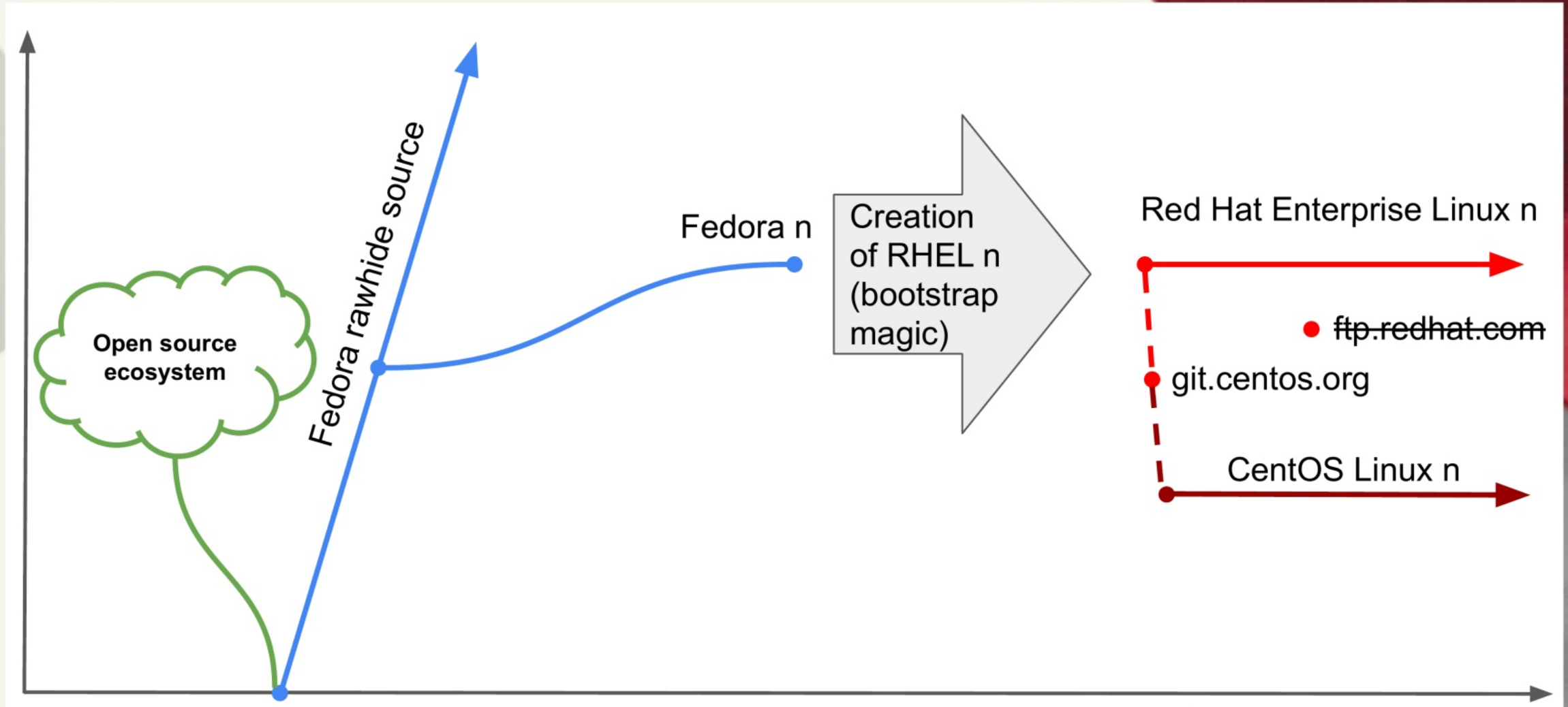

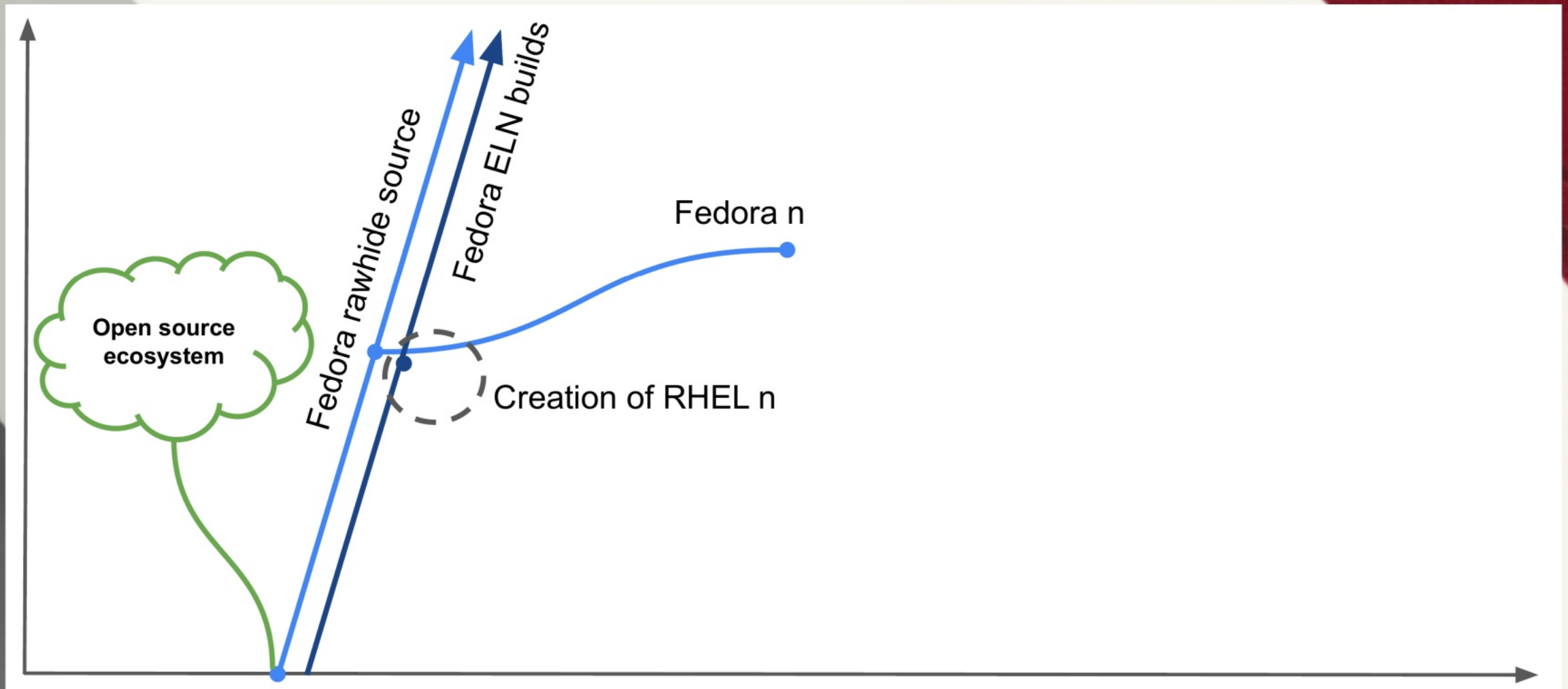

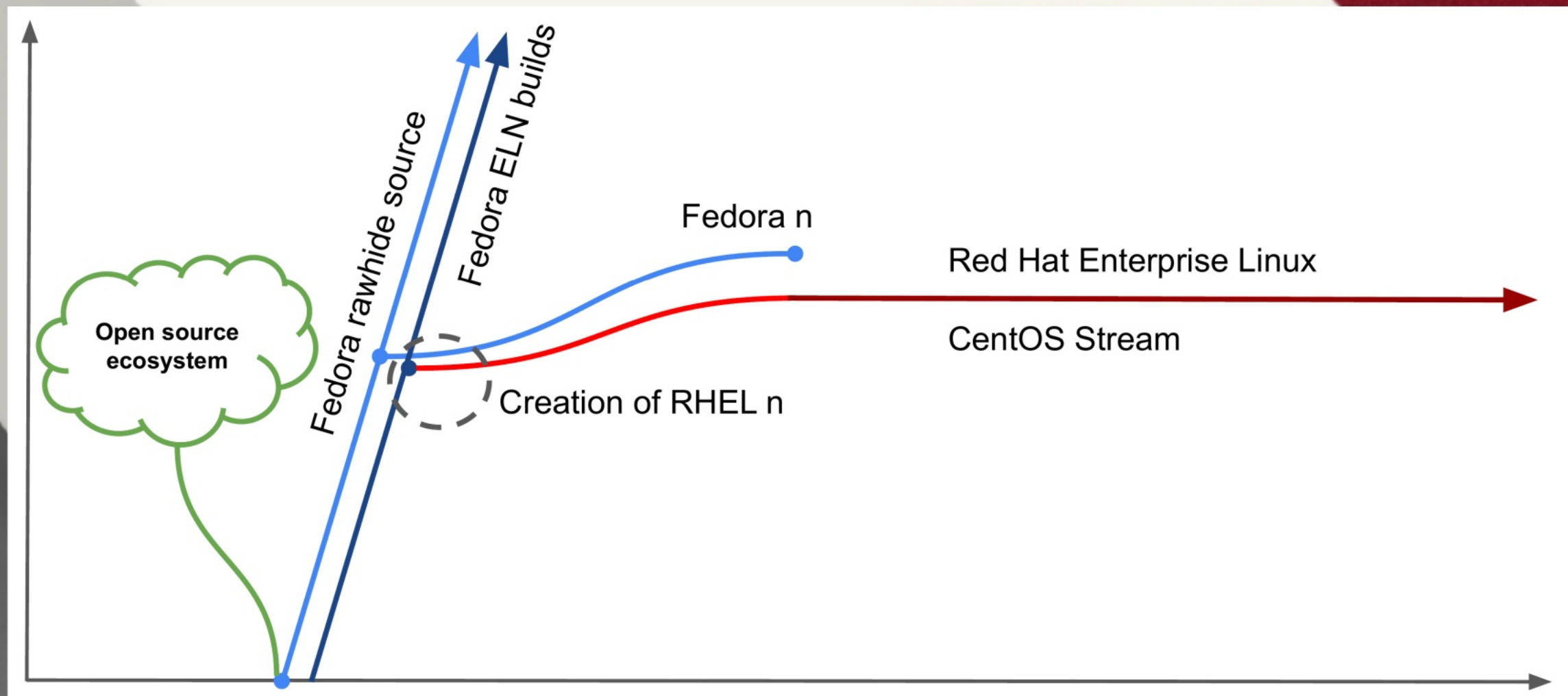

- Sunset of CentOS 8 by the end of 2021 (Unplanned)
- Sunset of CentOS 7 in 2024 (Planned)
- CentOS has become CentOS Stream
- Source code of packages and SPEC files are available:
<https://gitlab.com/redhat/centos-stream>
- SRPMS are not (but are they needed?)
- Both RHEL and CentOS Stream now upstreams to Fedora ELN
- Bug, enhancement and security reporting is now much cleaner
- Work made easier Alma, Rocky and other derivatives

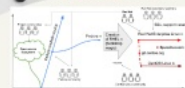

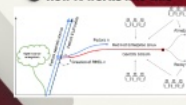
